AUSTRALIAN GOVERNMENT ANNOUNCES AU\$1.4 MILLION FOR RGECAF

We are delighted with the Australian Government announcement of 10 December 2021 that they will provide Au\$1.4 million to support Rotary Give Every Child A Future. These funds will help us deliver HPV vaccines to girls in Kiribati and support the RGECAF programme in Nauru. Good news for the children of the Pacific.

Rotary Give Every Child A Future was budgeted in two phases. The Australian Government's financial support is a great boost and means Rotary is now fully committed to HPV vaccination in Kiribati, our 'phase two'. We knew HPV in Kiribati was important but we not sure our fund raising would extend to be able to include this.

The Government money does not cover the entire cost of introducing HPV immunisation in Kiribati and we still need to complete our commitment to the other countries.

CENTENARY NUMBER PLATES FOR RGECAF

For several years Matamata (NZ) Rotarian David Hulme has considered promoting Rotary through car number plate surrounds, in the same way that businesses do. It took the Centenary year to bring the idea to fruition and throughout 2021 David and his fellow Rotarians have been promoting the number plates across New Zealand, with all profits being donated to RGECAF.

The specially designed centennial plate surrounds are manufactured in New Zealand and each NZ District has a designated club distributing the plates. In District 9930 Matamata Rotarians have visited most clubs which has added a social dimension to the project.

At \$15 for a set of two plates, approximately 1200 sets have been sold and more than \$5000 in profits have been donated to Rotary Give Every Child a Future so far.

"This gives Rotarians the opportunity to not only promote Rotary but also support a wonderful life changing and in some cases life-saving project in the Pacific, says David.

Clubs can also buy sets to include in New Member packs. A really simple way of getting new members to feel immediately that they are part of Rotary".

DIRECTOR'S UPDATE

The implementation of Rotary Give Every Child A Future is now well underway with children being vaccinated in most of the Pacific countries. This is despite the inevitable delays caused by COVID-19. Those remaining are expected to begin shortly

And the great news is that the Australian Government has agreed to support the project in Nauru and Kiribati with A\$1.4 million. Some of this money will be used to support the existing measles vaccination program in Kiribati, but importantly it will be enough to complete the program in Nauru and initiate the program for HPV vaccinations in Kiribati. HPV for Kiribati has been on the backburner until we were confident that the resources would be available to resource it fully.

Of course, this does not mean that Rotary's job is done. Over the next six months, we still need to fund the final year of the project in the Cook Islands, Niue and Tokelau, and the rotavirus program in Kiribati. This will require approximately US\$200,000. Then over the following couple of years, we will need to fund the balance of what is needed for HPV in Kiribati, estimated to be a further US\$600-700,000.

This continues to be a great way to celebrate the Centenary of Rotary in this part of the world and demonstrate the difference that Rotary can make. So, thank you again to all the Rotary Districts, Clubs, individual Rotarians, and others who have supported the project to date.

This program will save many lives amongst our near neighbours. It deserves our on-going support. UNICEF REPORT GREAT PROGRESS

Vaccinations are now underway in seven of the nine countries with the Cook Islands and Tokelau due to launch very early in 2022. That means that live-saving vaccines are now reaching infants and adolescents right across the Pacific, safeguarding them against potentially life-threatening diseases, all thanks to the substantial support received from Rotarians across Australia and New Zealand.

Most recently the three vaccines, (rotavirus, pneumococcal conjugate and human papillomavirus HPV), were launched in Nauru. A celebratory event was held by the Ministry of Health. It was encouraging and heart-warming to see a great community turn-out for the event along with recognition of Rotary's pivotal role in this important milestone.

As we look towards 2022 the focus will remain on reaching every child with these lifesaving vaccines and continuing the systems-strengthening work that will ensure the health workers and Ministries of Health across the nine Pacific countries are strongly positioned to continue these vaccination programs into the future. In the short-term our work remains focused on procuring and positioning vaccines for the coming year, ongoing strengthening to the cold chain systems and a continued commitment to building community acceptance and confidence for these vaccines.



As you know, the design of Rotary Give Every Child A Future has Rotary working with UNICEF to introduce three life-saving vaccines across nine Pacific Island countries; the Cook Islands, Kiribati, Nauru, Niue, Samoa, Tokelau, Tonga, Tuvalu and Vanuatu.

As the Asian Development Bank was financing the introduction of these vaccines into four of the countries (Vanuatu, Tonga, Samoa and Tuvalu), Rotary is funding regional and other supporting activities in those four countries and fully funding the programme in the other five countries.

The commencement of vaccinations in Nauru is a major milestone for the project being our first fully Rotary funded country and we were pleased to see the news was captured by <u>ABC's Pacific Beat</u> (first item).

UNICEF has also produced a video for us featuring Dr Frances Vulivuli (UNICEF Pacific Health and Nutrition Specialist) which is available on our <u>YouTube channel (1 and 2 minute versions</u>).
